Goal Two

LESNW recognises the value of each of our diverse learning communities as a strength. All LESNW communities cooperate and collaborate for the betterment of each community and LESNW.

Strategies:

- 2.1 Embed across our communities the mindset that we are interdependent parts of one greater whole (we are truly better together)
- 2.2 Actively create, seek and promote multiple opportunities for individuals and learning communities to engage with, learn from and assist others within, across and beyond our community of communities (other Lutheran Education regions, other independent school and ELC networks, including international networks)

Goal Three

Holistic learning that serves other and enhances the world

Our learning communities value the gifts of all individuals and work with them to co-create a hope-filled future through excellence in learning.

Strategies:

- 3.1 (Define) Develop shared values, beliefs and language to strengthen holistic learning across all learning communities
- 3.2 (Communicate) Communicate and celebrate what excellence in learning looks like in a Lutheran learning community
- 3.3 (Co-create) Cultivate and strengthen a culture of collaboration and co-creation to inspire excellence in learning, support a sense of unity and a commitment to ongoing improvement

Goal Four

Strengthening the agility and sustainability of learning communities

All LESNW learning communities work to operate at a sustainable level enabled by the Regional Office and available tools and resources. LESNW works to build the capacity of their leaders for strategic visioning and responsible decision making in developing and maintaining an agile and sustainable community.

Strategies:
